Home Learning

All lessons will now take place on Seesaw and will be supported by the resources sent home on Monday. Class teachers can be contacted each day on Seesaw, during school hours, should you have any queries or need additional guidance or help.



In-school Supervision

School will remain open for vulnerable pupils and the pupils of key workers. If you are eligible for your child to attend school, it is only to be used if no other safe alternative is available to you. It is in everyone's best interests to minimise contacts during this pandemic to safeguard all pupils and adults.

In school, pupils will be supervised as they complete their Seesaw activities each day. No face-to-face teaching will take place. Depending on pupil numbers, it may not be possible for all lessons to be completed; parents are still expected to review work each evening and complete it as necessary.

All supervision needs to be booked in advance. Please contact Mrs Wright by phone/email on hwright575@c2ken.net by **Thursday at 3pm** each week to book days for the following week. This is essential in order to ensure staffing can be organised. As a school we will do our best to support you, but all supervision is dependent on enough staff being available.

Pupils who attend school will need to wear their school uniform, bring their schoolbag, break and packed lunch. No school meals are being served.

School will be closed the week beginning Monday 15th to Friday 19th February for half-term. During this week there will be no lessons on Seesaw.
