Covid-19 Update

As a school we are mindful to keep the school community as safe as possible. Please be aware of the following:

Warm clothing

All pupils should bring a coat to school - this is important for outdoor breaks and lessons. During the school day we aim to keep your child as comfortable as possible while also ensuring adequate ventilation within the classroom. If your child is cold they should wear another layer of clothing under their uniform. If necessary, they may also wear their coat in class.



Covid-19 Symptoms

The three possible symptoms of Covid-19 remain:

- A new, continuous cough
- A high temperature/fever
- A loss or change of taste or smell

If your child displays any of these symptoms they should have a PCR test. Please email results to school.

With the new variant, we are witnessing an increased range of possible Covid-19 symptoms, including a sore head, sore throat, and runny nose. Please be extremely vigilant regarding this wider range of symptoms. **Any pupil who is not well, should NOT attend school.** Pupils should be closely monitored at home and should not return to school until they recover.

If Covid-19 is suspected they should arrange a PCR test before returning. If the PCR test is positive they will need to self-isolate for 10 days. The Public Health Agency will advise you further about this.

Close Contacts

A close contact is someone in the same household as a positive case or someone who has assisted a child in a school setting with intimate care. A child who is in the same class as your child is no longer deemed to be a close contact.

If your child is a close contact, they will be contacted by the Public Health Agency. They should isolate and take daily Lateral Flow Tests. If the Lateral Flow Test is positive they should self-isolate for 10 days. Please contact school if your child is a close contact for further advice.

School should be notified of all positive cases of Covid-19 and all pupils who are close contacts.

If any family needs to contact the school during evenings and weekends, use the email address hwright575@c2ken.net. Only Covid-19 concerns will be dealt with out of school hours.

Face-to-face Learning

It is our priority for school to remain open and fully functioning. This is becoming increasingly challenging as cases spread. This in turn affects levels of staffing and the ability to fill vacant roles is difficult.

As a precaution, I would encourage you to have a 'Plan B' in place should we need to move a class to remote learning on Seesaw. Be assured that this will only take place when all other options have been exhausted.

Thank you for your ongoing support. To continue to help us, keep your child at home if they are unwell, keep us informed of any positive cases and close contacts and socially distance and wear a face covering within the playground.

School will be closed the week beginning Monday 14th February for half-term. It will reopen on Monday 21st February.
